

## **Teacher Pay & Revenue Package**

## The education-related bills include:

- <u>HB 1023xx</u> is the \$353.5 million teacher pay raise bill and would go into effect beginning with the 2018-2019 school year. It would:
  - o Increase the minimum salary schedule by at least \$5,000 at every level.
  - o Provide larger raises for more experienced teachers, including a \$7,700 increase to the minimum salary schedule for a teacher with 25 years of experience.
  - o Fund an average \$6,1000 teacher pay raise.
  - o Download a copy of the proposed minimum salary schedule here.
- <u>HB 1026xx</u> is the \$52 million support employee pay raise bill and would go into effect beginning with the 2018-2019 school year. It would:
  - o Provide a full-time support employee pay raise of \$1,250 if the employee stays employed in the same district. (For less than full-time employees, the amount of the salary increase would be prorated based on hours worked).
- <u>HB 3705</u> is the FY19 education appropriations bill. It would:
  - Appropriate \$33 million in funding for textbooks and instructional materials.
  - o Restore \$17 million cut from the education budget this year.

## The revenue-raising bills include:

- <u>HB 1010xx</u> is the 76-vote revenue bill used to fund the plan and would raise nearly \$500 million in FY 19. Read the <u>fiscal impact statement here</u>. It includes:
  - o Increase in the gross production tax (GPT) from 2 to 5 percent
  - o \$1-a-pack cigarette tax
  - o 3-cent gas/6-cent diesel tax
  - \$5 a night hotel/motel tax
- <u>HB 1011xx</u> caps itemized deductions and is <u>projected</u> to net an additional \$94 million in revenue for FY19.
- <u>HB 1013xx</u> is the ball-and-dice gaming expansion is <u>projected</u> to net \$24 million in revenue for FY19 and potentially more in future years.
