Involvement of Parents in the Title I Program

To involve parents in the Title I program at Madison Elementary, the following practices have been established:

- o The school convenes an annual meeting to inform parents of Title I students about Title I requirements and about the right of parents to be involved in the Title I program.
 - o This traditionally takes place during a PTO general assembly meeting.
- o The school offers a flexible number of meetings for Title I parents, such as meetings in the morning or evening.
 - o Title I updates traditionally have been held in the evenings along with other PTO sponsored events (ie; Coffee with the Principal).
- o The school involves parents of Title I students in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review*, and improvement of the school's Title I programs and the Title I parental involvement policy.**
 - o A parent volunteer serves on our campus Title I committee.
 - o Information discussed during Title I meetings are traditionally shared during the following: PTO general assembly meetings and other PTO sponsored events.
- o The school provides parents of Title I students with timely information about Title I programs.
 - o Information discussed during Title I meetings are traditionally shared during the following: PTO general assembly meetings and other PTO sponsored events.
- o The school provides parents of Title I students with an explanation of the curriculum used at the school, the assessments used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet.
 - o Information regarding curriculum and assessments is shared during parent orientation nights and curriculum nights during the fall and spring semesters.
 - o If requested by parents of Title I students, the school provides opportunities for regular meetings that allow the parents to participate in decisions relating to the education of their children.
 - o Madison Elementary accommodates all students/parent needs in an effort to keep all parties informed and updated.

Building Capacity for Involvement
