## Wilson Elementary Parent Engagement Plan 2023-24

## **Parent Involvement**

Wilson Elementary School has jointly developed with parents, teachers and staff this parent involvement plan. This plan establishes the expectations for parent and community involvement at Wilson, a Title I assisted school.

The school convenes an annual meeting to inform parents of Title I students about Title I requirements and about the right of parents to be involved in the Title I program.

Annually, Wilson Elementary will hold a Curriculum Night, to which all parents are invited. At this meeting, the principal and staff inform the parents of the school's participation in Title I, explain the requirements of Title I, and the right of parents to be involved in the school.

Wilson Elementary will improve communication to parents on supporting their child's academic goals.

In an effort to help parents assist their students with academics at home, we will have a reading and math morning event each semester. Parents can come to school with their students and attend a reading or math lesson in the classroom. The teacher will model instruction over an essential standard and provide tips for how parents can reinforce these skills at home.

## **Parent Assistance**

Wilson Elementary provides a regular time for parents, by having teachers available to conference with parents between conferences, to meet with teachers to formulate suggestions, to participate in decisions relating to the education of their children, and to respond to any suggestions as soon as possible.

The school provides parents of Title I students with an explanation of the curriculum used at the school, the assessments used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet.

Wilson Elementary provides parents a description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, forms of academic assessment used to measure progress, and proficiency levels students are expected to meet. This is done through the Curriculum Night, parent meetings, parent/teacher conferences, weekly email, Seesaw, classroom newsletters, and Blackboard messaging.
