Cost to Attend MNTC

MNTC programs are also free to high school students who attend public, private or home school in Moore, Norman or south OKC. There may be minimal supply costs or transportation requirements in some programs. Make sure to ask your MNTC Career Advisor about specific cost or transportation details during enrollment.

MNTC Tuition Assistance

The MNTC Tuition Assistance is available to in-district high school graduates who begin a career program before their 21st birthday. The assistance may only be applied to class tuition. Tuition Assistance recipients are required to pay the student resource fee, and are responsible for the cost of any testing, books, tools, equipment, clothing, shoes or additional supplies and fees needed for the program..

Eligibility Requirements:

- High school graduate or equivalent recipients
- Residents of the MNTC school district
- Acceptance into an MNTC career program
- Student begins class prior to their 21st birthday
- Students attending MNTC while in high school must have had at least a "B" as their final semester grade while attending MNTC and stayed within MNTC's attendance policy.

Oklahoma's Promise (OHLAP/ACE)*

MNTC high school students have the opportunity to earn computer and lab science credit for some of our career programs. Look for the asterisk next to program names to see if you qualify for Oklahoma's Promise/ACE credit.

You will take courses to earn state certifications in Radiation, Nitrous Oxide, Sealants, and Coronal Polish, as well as take the National Certified Dental Assistant (CDA) examination. Diagnostic Medical Sonography ♦

Sonographers use equipment that directs high frequency sound waves into a patient's body that reflect echoes and forms an image that may be videotaped, transmitted, or photographed for diagnosis by a physician. During patient scans, you will look for subtle clues that contrast healthy against unhealthy areas by taking measurements, calculating values, and analyzing the results into a preliminary finding report. The MNTC DMS program is a general learning concentration. Certification exams for the American Registry of Diagnostic Medical Sonography ARDMS include: Sonography Principles and Instrumentation (SPI), Abdomen (AB), and Obstetrics and Gynecology (OB/GYN).

Surgical Technologists function as a member of the sterile surgical team in the scrub role, and are responsible for establishing and maintaining the sterile field throughout the entire surgery. You will train to handle the instrumentation, supplies, and equipment necessary for all surgical procedures, and will have an understanding of each of the procedures being performed in order to anticipate the needs of the surgeon. The learning program includes development of knowledge, ethics, personal behavior, and skill sets to become highly detailed and to work under great pressure. You will conduct clinical rotations at many OKC metro hospitals and surgery centers as you prepare to sit for a national certification for surgical technology at the end of the program.
