



### Utah Study

- In 2011 55 American Indian students in KINDERGARTEN were referred to law enforcement!
- No white students were.

- "The Impact of Racial Bias on American Indian Youth in Oklahoma" found no differences in parental interaction and care from other racial groups.
- It concluded that officials' attitudes and treatment were the causes of different treatment.

### Suspensions Nationally

- Native American boys are suspended twice as often as white boys.
- Native American girls are suspended three times as often as white girls.

- •From French and Provencal derived from masca 'witch'!











- According to Department of Justice analysis, "American Indians are more likely than people of other races to experience violence at the hands of someone of a different race."In Fryberg's study, findings show that Native stereotypes lead to a boost in self-esteem for non-Natives, specifically European Americans; "American Indian social representations were associated with lower self-esteem for American Indians and higher self-esteem for European Americans."
